Virginia's Merci Boxcar

The Merci Train was a train of 49 French railroad box cars filled with tens of thousands of gifts of gratitude from at least that many individual French citizens. They were showing their appreciation for the more than 700 American box cars of relief goods sent to them by (primarily) individual Americans in 1948. The Merci Train arrived in New York harbor on February 3rd, 1949 and each of the 48 American states at that time received one of the gift laden box cars. The 49th box car was shared by Washington D.C. and the Territory of Hawaii. Parades and ceremonies of welcome were conducted in the state capitols and major cities of almost all the states. The largest and most attended was in New York City where more than 200,000 people turned out to welcome that state's assigned box car.

The symbol of the Merci Train, shown next to the French flag, is a frontal view of a steam engine with flowers on the pilot which are symbolic of Flanders Field, where many American "Doughboys" from WW1 are buried. The drawing was adopted as the official symbol of the French Merci Train Committee, and a plaque of the drawing was placed on each of the Merci box cars. The committee also had gift tags made bearing the symbol, and one accompanied each of the more than 52,000 gifts that came in the box cars.

In early 1949, there were thousands of World War 1 veterans and millions of WW2 veterans still living who had memories of spending as much as a week being transported to, or from, the battlefronts of the wars in that exact same type of boxcar. There were no seats, no windows, no toilets, and no sleeping or dining accommodations. Each man and his 39 traveling companions had barely enough space to sit down and they had to fit their bodies in rows to have enough room to lie down for sleep. Most of the veterans that survived the war had memories of those final rides and conversations with buddies, including some who were killed and never made it back to the U.S.A. Those surviving veterans decided to make the little gift boxcars memorials to the those lost buddies and the sacrifices that they made to save the world from the tyranny of Nazism. Thus it is that, for almost 75 years, they have volunteered to keep the little antique boxcars repaired and honorably displayed in an effort to memorialize all those who had given their all for the freedom of people everywhere in the world. We think that all of those heroes should continue to be honored by the continued preservation of these humble symbols of their sacrifices.

Virginia's Merci boxcar is in the Newport News War museum in the same pristine condition as when it was received. Merci.

Each year thousands of dollars are raised for the Fund through donations and the sale of Nurses Training pins, however, the Boland Trust committee is not receiving applications for those funds. There are scholarships for students pursuing Associate or Bachelor Degrees and for Advanced Degrees. Information regarding the scholarships can be found on the Forty & Eight website and from Terri Taylor at Nationale.

Honoring the Absent, Remembering the Fallen:

The Intersection of Wreaths Across America and our POW/MIA's



As the holiday season unfolds, a wave of touching remembrance sweeps across America each December. Wreaths Across America (WAA) transforms the somber land-scapes of military cemeteries into places of holiday remembrance as thousands lay wreaths on the graves of the nation's service

members. Each wreath placed is more than a decorative piece; it symbolizes respect and a reminder of the ultimate sacrifice made by the fallen.

Volunteers of all ages participate, from Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts to Gold Star families and veterans. The act of laying a wreath is accompanied by the recitation of the service member's name, a gesture that ensures their memory lives on.

This physical and vocal acknowledgment aligns seamlessly with the POW/MIA precepts, which stress the importance of never forgetting those who have served and sacrificed. Furthermore, this is why we must continue to bring them all home so those of us left have a physical place to go and remember their ultimate sacrifice.

POW/MIA Precepts: Never Forget

The POW/MIA precepts are a set of guiding principles dedicated to ensuring that American service members who were Prisoners of War or who went Missing in Action are never forgotten. The National League of POW/MIA Families, established in 1970, advocates for the fullest possible accounting of missing U.S. military personnel from all conflicts.

The primary tenet of the POW/MIA precepts is remembrance. Just as Wreaths Across America seeks to honor those who have passed, the POW/ MIA precents demand that we remember the struggles and sacrifices of POWs and MIAs. The motto "You Are Not Forgotten" encapsulates this sentiment, echoing through military and civilian communities.

Shared Values: A Unified Message

Both Wreaths Across America and the League of POW/MIA Families share a common goal: to ensure that the sacrifices of U.S. service members are never forgotten. The act of placing wreaths on graves mirrors the spirit of the POW/MIA flag's promise to remember the missing. Each wreath, like the flag, serves as a visual and tactile reminder of those who served, those who are missing, and those who paid the ultimate price.

WAA's efforts to involve the vounger generation through educational initiatives reflect the POW/MIA precepts' emphasis on teaching the value of remembrance. School programs and community events foster a culture of respect and honor, ensuring tthe stories and sacrifices of service members are passed down through generations.

Conclusion: Eternal Remembrance

In tying Wreaths Across America to the POW/MIA precepts, we are reminded of the profound respect owed to those who have intersection of these initiatives highlights the enduring served. The importance of remembrance in American society. Each wreath laid and each name spoken ensures that the sacrifices of POWs, MIAs, and all fallen service members are honored. In a world that often moves swiftly forward, these acts of remembrance provide a moment to pause, reflect, and give thanks for the freedoms we enjoy today.

Through Wreaths Across America and the enduring principles of the POW/MIA precepts, we honor the legacies of the brave men and women who have served, ensuring that their sacrifices are never forgotten. 
